

Home/Farm Owner Electrical Permit Application Information

1. **Electrical Service - Home/Farm Owners can no longer install their own service** unless they are a licensed Saskatchewan electrical journeyman **OR** an immediate family member is a licensed electrical journeyman and is installing the service.

Immediate family is defined as: father, mother, father-in-law, mother-in-law, spouse, brother, sister, son, daughter, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparents, grandparents-in-law, common-law spouses.
2. **Electrical Service for Home/Farm Owners with a SaskPower/Utility customer operated disconnect (breaker) ahead of the service** may install their own service. This is used mainly for farmyards.
3. **Addition of a Sub-Panel** - example - installing an electrical panel in your house or garage fed from the main panel in your house.
4. **Single family dwellings with or without an attached garage - branch circuit wiring.** This fee of \$300.00 is for single family dwellings 200 amps or less. If a service connection or sub-panel is required please refer to items #1, #2 or #3, which would then require additional permit(s).
5. **Wiring of a farm outbuilding - branch circuit wiring.** This fee of \$75.00 is for each farm outbuilding 200 amps or less. If a service connection or sub-panel is required please refer to items #1, #2 or #3, which would then require additional permit(s).
6. **Basement, addition or room renovation to a residential building - branch circuit wiring.** Examples include: kitchen renovation, family room, or an addition to the residence. As long as the work being performed is not more than 75% of the residence being wired or rewired, it is a fee of \$75.00. If it is more than 75% then refer to item #4. If a service connection or sub-panel is required please refer to items #1, #2 or #3, which would then require additional permit(s).
7. **Residential garage (wiring or rewiring) - branch circuit wiring only.** If a service connection or sub-panel is required please refer to items #1, #2 or #3, which would then require additional permit(s).
8. **Equipment Wiring** - this is for "hard wired" equipment only. This would include hot tubs, swimming pools, electric heaters, furnace, air conditioners, etc. If a sub-panel is required please refer to item #3, which would then require an additional permit.
9. **Addition or Replacement of lights, switches, outlets or smoke detectors.** List how many of each will be added on the application. Any 220 volt plugs are to be listed under receptacles, (examples of 220 volt plugs would be clothes dryers, ranges, or cord connected construction heaters). If the total amount of the items exceeds the \$75.00 fee, do not use this section, refer to item #6 on the application form.
10. **Re-application fee** - continuing work from original permit. A renewal can be done one time only, up to one year from the date of the original permit.
