Environmental Assessment


 Environmental Assessment (EA) is a process used to assess and predict the environmental effects of a proposed project before it is carried out.

 In Saskatchewan, process is formalized through The Environmental Assessment Act

 Ensures that development in Saskatchewan proceeds with suitable environmental safeguards in a manner that is broadly understood by the public.



Environmental Approval Process



Environmental Impact Assessment

- "development" defined in section 2(d) of *The Environmental Assessment Act* as:
 - Effect on unique, rare or endangered feature of environment
 - Substantial use of provincial resource (pre-empting other uses)
 - Cause emission of unregulated waste or pollutant
 - Cause widespread public concern because of environmental changes
 - Involve new technology
 - Have a significant impact on the environment or necessitate further development likely to have significant impact



Environmental Impact Assessment

Includes a series of legislated and policy steps

Provides both technical experts and the public an opportunity to review project details

- Information collected from public and government reviewers informs Minister's decision to:
 - Approve the project with terms and conditions; or
 - Refuse to approve the project

- The Planning and Development Act, 2007
 - Development permits * PDA definition
 - The Statements of Provincial Interest Regulations
 - The Dedicated Lands Regulations
 - Municipal zoning permits issued under bylaw

Guidelines for the Preparation of the Terms of Reference:

- A TOR template serves as a starting point regarding information needed in the TOR
- TOR includes a plan on how the proponent will solicit public input in the project area:
 - Identifying groups to be engaged
 - Holding public meetings



Compliance Assurance

- The Environmental Assessment Act includes measures for compliance assurance
 - Ability to investigate compliance with terms & conditions
 - Strong deterrent for non-compliance
- Compliance will also be monitored through on-site inspections by ministry staff
- Ministry of Environment Compliance Audit group may also perform periodic audits
